RE: Resource Consent Submission

Tēnā koe Mr Fergusson,

I am writing in support of the resource consent application made for the purpose of the Residential Care Facility at 19A Baird Road, Opotiki.

The Pou Oranga Whaiora Methamphetamine residential service is an essential service for Opotiki and the whole Eastern Bay of Plenty. This service was co-designed with input from a wide range of stakeholders, including community members, whānau with lived experience, rangatahi, frontline practitioners, government agencies, NGOs, and the Police. Statistics highlight that Ōpōtiki and Kawerau have the highest rates of methamphetamine use per capita in New Zealand.

Te Pou Oranga Whaiora is a newly established service, funded through the Ministry of Justice's Proceeds of Crime Fund, aimed at reducing methamphetamine-related harm in the Eastern Bay of Plenty region.

In partnership with Te Whatu Ora, Te Aka Whai Ora, the Eastern Bay Iwi Provider Alliance, and the New Zealand Police (Bay of Plenty), Te Pou Oranga o Whakatōhea successfully proposed the development, implementation, and delivery of the Te Pou Oranga Whaiora service. This initiative is being carried out in collaboration with the Eastern Bay Iwi Provider Alliance, which includes Tūwharetoa ki Kawerau, Te Tohu o Te Ora o Ngāti Awa, Tūhoe Hauora, and Te Pou Oranga o Whakatōhea.

The goals of the new service are to:

- Achieve a sustained reduction in methamphetamine-related harm and other substance-related harm, leading to fewer family harm incidents and a decrease in local criminal activity.
- Collaborate with the New Zealand Police to shift focus towards prevention rather than enforcement.

- Empower tangata whaiora (individuals seeking wellbeing) and their whānau to improve their health and social wellbeing.
- Partner with local health agencies and other services, such as Whānau Ora, to strengthen access pathways for tangata whaiora and their whānau to receive support from various health and social services.

As a person who has held an imperative position in the community with regards to providing adequate support to the people of Whakatōhea, to those of the community of Ōpōtiki and the surrounding communities, I fully endorse this resource consent.
